Below is a brief overview for the April 28th meeting:

Senior Center Report

TV and Wii are set-up. We have set up classes to teach the seniors how to use the system. The first class is scheduled with the senior wellness group on May 5th and then the general senior public on May 13th.

Centennial Park Update

Design Concepts has drafted the master plan into the computer and is getting ready to do a quick and rough grading plan of the site to be sure everything makes sense in terms of elevations and existing site conditions. They will be adding some other important information such as surface types so Jeff from SGM has a feel for what they will be considering for materials. The soils report just arrived to Design Concepts and they are currently reviewing

The DoLA contract was approved by City Council at their last meeting and the Mayor has signed it. Also, the property north of "The Great Bowl" has been purchased by the City.

Pool Update

When we turned on the water, we found a leak in the water main. Luckily we had already bid out replacing the line to be pro-active. PXI is currently replacing the main and adding a separate shut-off for the bath house. Once PXI completes the water line, they will be installing the sewer line for the pool filter's backwash. Linda has already started preparing the pool for this season. We will be ordering new diving boards and furniture.

Learn to Swim registrations

Registrations for swimming lessons started on April 14th. On the first day, we had over 130 on-line registrations starting at 12:17 AM. To date, 49 of our 93 classes are full.

Roan Field Update

The field has officially been completed. Lights are working. We will be closing out the GOCO grant in the next few weeks.

Parks Maintenance Facility Update

We continue to move forward with the planning. Tom will give an update at the meeting.





Keeping Fields Unlocked

At the last PRAB meeting, a concern about fields being locked was brought up. Staff is recommending that we continue to keep Cooper and Roan fields locked. The other fields will be left unlocked, unless they are already prepped for an upcoming game. Staff would like to discuss this idea further with PRAB.

MINUTES OF THE March 10th MEETING: Mark made a motion to approve and accept the minutes of the March 10th meeting. Christy 2nd the motion. Motion passed by a voice vote.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC: No public present.

SENIOR CENTER: Mildred had nothing new to report. Aleks purchased a Wii and accessories. The wall has been prepared and ready for Stereo Unlimited to set up TV.

INTRODUCTION OF NEW PARKS & RECREATION EMPLOYEES: Aleks introduced Jennifer Reich as the new Events Coordinator for the Recreation department and Angie Wilkins as the new Administrative Assistant for the Parks department.

JUSTIN STONE-EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT PRESENTATION: In the Fall of 2006, Justin was approved for a project at the Senior Center in the amount of \$1,750. This project was for a flower bed. Justin was under budget with a total cost of \$1,140. He was able to be under budget by donated materials from Centennial Gardens and

Kuersten Concrete. He also received help from volunteers. A total of 200 hours were used to complete this project.

PARKING ON ACACIA AVENUE: Aleks will bring issue up to Council in next meeting. The request will be to allow 3 hour parking from the hours of 6a.m.-10p.m., with Chief addressing the issue. Concerns were made about field access with the parking. Tom addressed landscaping issues.

CENTENNIAL PARK: Aleks gave an update on architect progress with SGM and Design Concepts. Approval from Council to sign the DoLA grant agreement will be on April 16th agenda.

ARBOR DAY: Tom W. discussed past events with Arbor Day and planned activities for this year. There will be a presentation on April 16th to Council. There are activities planned for April 25th from 10-12a.m. with tree trimming and a class in the Council Chambers.

PARK FACILITY: Tom W. gave update on Parks Facility. White Construction has been approved as the GM/GC for the project. This decision was made due to the time and budget that White Construction has put into the project. They are also the company building the new Justice Center. There are some issues with County Rd. access to the building, but a workshop has been planned with Council for future plans with the road.

JAY RICKSTREW: Jay had 4 main items of concern. Fee structure for Little League, vs Recreation Programs. There was also a concern for Unorganized vs Organized and fee schedules for those programs. Jay asked for a long term solution for all programs. Aleks recommended a Cost Analysis with GreenPlay LLC. No decision was made about this cost analysis at this time. Another concern was the decline of participant numbers in Recreation Programs. Board members noted that this is a trend throughout all sports and activities in Rifle. There was concern on advertisement and fees. The final concern that Jay had was locks on the baseball fields. Tom W. informed that Graham is always available for public use if it is not being used. Some issues addressed were cost of pitching mounds and damage that may incur from unsupervised use.

NEXT MEETING: The next meeting is scheduled for April 28th, 2008.

OTHER: Aleks gave an update on GOCO grant. The grant for Deerfield landscaping in the amount of \$66,000 looks good. There are still problems with scheduling events with the school district. Tom W. informed the board that the Forest Service will be having a controlled burn in Rifle Mountain Park, the date is unknown at this time.

Meeting was adjourned by Chairman Ed Weiss at 7:00 p.m.

SERIES OF 2007**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF RIFLE, COLORADO, ADOPTING A FEE
SCHEDULE FOR THE CITY'S PUBLIC PARKS AND RECREATION AREAS
PURSUANT TO SECTION 11-6-70 OF THE RIFLE MUNICIPAL CODE.

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 43, Series o 2006, the Rifle City Council adopted a revised Section 11-6-70 of the Rifle Municipal Code ("RMC"), which states that the City may assess fees or user charges for the use of any public park or public recreation facility, the amount of which fees shall be as established by resolution of the City Council and may be amended from time to time by resolution; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with this Section, the City of Rifle Parks and Recreation Department has established the Parks and Recreation Fee Schedules attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference as Exhibits A, B, and C; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed the proposed Fee Schedules and, pursuant to RMC Section 11-6-70, desires to adopt the Exhibits and order them to be posted at City Hall.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIFLE, COLORADO, THAT:

1. The City incorporates the foregoing recitals as findings by the City Council.
2. The City of Rifle Parks and Recreation Fee Schedules attached hereto as Exhibits A, B, and C and incorporated herein by this reference are hereby adopted by the City.
3. Pursuant to Section 11-6-70 of the Rifle Municipal Code, the City of Rifle Parks and Recreation Fee Schedules hereby adopted shall be posted at City Hall in the Parks and Recreation Department.

THIS RESOLUTION was read, passed, and adopted by the Rifle City Council at a regular meeting held this 3rd day of January, 2007.

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Discount Schedule for use of Parks & Recreation Facilities

Fee waiving for one-time activities put on by charitable or civic organizations will be dealt with on a case by case basis with the final decision being made by the Parks or Recreation Director. All conditions listed below must be met.

Discounts are given to organized youth (under the age of 18) sports, which have a majority of participants (51% of players) living in Rifle, with the conditions specified below. Discounts are not given for light usage, field preparation or scorekeeper.

Discounts for organized youth (U18) teams

1 st Year Team*	80%
2 nd Year Team*	60%

*1st Year & 2nd Year Team means a new sports organization. Existing teams with major changes in leagues will be evaluated by the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board to determine if they are eligible for the 1st Year or 2nd Year Team discount.

Conditions for reserving any facility:

- Any organization requesting a fee waiver must submit a complete application.
- Fees must be paid in advance of usage.
- Facilities must be reserved at least one week in advance.
- Cancellations must be made 24 hours in advance to receive a credit.
(Cancellations due to weather are exempt).
- Facilities must only be used during dates and time reserved through the Recreation Department.
- Facilities must be left in the same, if not better, condition than arrival. (i.e. pick up trash)
- Organized teams must furnish Liability Insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 adding the City of Rifle as additionally insured and must give a copy to the Recreation Department before use of the facility.
- Any violations of the above rules will result in loss of privileges of using the facilities.
